India Earthquake Appeal

The response in this District to the above appeal has, as is usual, been exceptional. To date a sum of approximately £8500 has been channelled through our District Treasurer to go direct to India via Lions contacts in the affected region. VDG Ram Jaggi has made the contacts, including Past International President Rohit Mehta and they will see that the money goes where it is needed most. International Relations Officer, Lion Mukesh Palan, has also tracked another £35k to £45k has been donated by Lions through temples and other organisations this is absolutely magnificent. On my travels around the clubs recently, I have met many Lions who have just returned from the affected area and the feeling is that there is now enough immediate aid and that what is need now is some medium to long term planning to rehabilitate those families who have lost everything. This is, of course, in line with the aims of LCIF who are also working closely with the District Governor of the affected region. So please fellow Lions, think now about LCIF as our foundation which will do all it can to help those who need help most - and in the most practical way. Do not forget also that there is an LCIF fund set up for El Salvador who will also need a lot of for the medium to long term future. Last year, \$25 million went into LCIF but \$42 million went out in aid; this year the amount that goes out is likely to be even larger; let us as a District ensure that we do all we can to top up those coffers. Think LCIF!!

PU101 & MD Directory Forms

Now is the time of the year for club elections for next years officers. You will have already received the PU101 Form from LCI which requires details of the President, Secretary and Treasurer; very shortly you will receive a form from MD HQ asking for details of the President and Secretary to go in the MD Directory. Last year the MD directories were late going out due in some part to the late submission of information by clubs. I remind you now that MD forms are required to be returned by 30 April and the LCI forms by 31 May, Both forms, when completed, must be sent to Lion Keith Tooley, District Administration Co-ordinator, who will collate them all and send them together to MD HQ and LCI.
