Seventy tables were immaculately decorated with table cloth, balloons, and glitter to make this the event in honour of our senior citizens, something to enjoy and remember.Tables were arranged in red, blue, green and yellow colour zones .Through this colour scheme, guests could quickly identify the seating arrangements. Young and not so young, all joined forces to help put the event together. Harrow Leisure Centre has been the chosen venue for the Senior Citizens Celebration since its inception in 2000. Although costs have spiralled over the years it hasn't deterred Lions from holding the event. Responding to the centennial challenge and being aware of the environmental issues at the moment, they decided to plant an avenue of 10 English oak trees, targeting an area adjacent to the town allotments. A popular walk along the River Great Ouse which flows around the town of Olney and frequented by many ramblers, dog walkers and local townspeople, this seemed a perfect location in which to showcase Lions concerns for the environment.

Lots of negotiation had to be done between the Club and a very receptive Olney Town Council before the final location was determined and then it was all go to get our trees in the ground before the winter set in.

It was on a cold, wintry day when a number of the members turned up complete with semi mature trees, stakes, tools, compost and not a little enthusiasm to commence the task of planting the next 100 years heritage.

Under the expert guidance of Lion Martin Ward, the club's resident horticulturist and project manager, boots were donned, protective gear put on and we got under way. First task was to lay out the line which the trees would take and over the next few hours and dodging rain showers, holes were dug, trees inserted, stakes and rabbit collars affixed and our 'Avenue' slowly appeared.

The result? 10 strong, upright new baby additions to the community of Olney which as Lion President Trevor Aldred states "will grow to maturity over the next hundred years and be repeated in our other town of Newport Pagnell when we can identify a suitable location. All going well, we will identify an area suitable for receiving a similar Centennial planting and a further 20 new trees will take root."

Enfield Lion Runs the Mumbai Marathon to Raise Funds

On Sunday, 21 January 2018, I successfully ran the Mumbai Marathon – 26.3 miles on a hot and humid day, along with my colleague, Mr Martin Klein, a Consultant Surgeon, Barnet Hospital. We were encouraged enthusiastically by the warm and exuberant Mumbaikars.

We ran the marathon to raise awareness of our UK Registered Charity – Empowerment Through Education-(ETE-U.K) www.eteii.co.uk. The charity was established four years ago and funds raised have been able to enhance the infra structural facilities and learning



experiences of the children of the Government High School in my native village Talakondapally, 65km from Hyderabad, India.

ETE-UK is generously supported by the members of Lions Club of Enfield and their family and friends, as a result of which the School is now equipped with a science laboratory – fully equipped to conduct experiments, library, computer room and digital classroom (10 computers with internet connection), benches and electricity for all classrooms, dining hall, toilets and clean drinking water for the students..

ETE through its scholarship are also providing bursaries for the college education to over 6 students from the village. Over the coming years, ETE aim to improve the facilities in the primary school, and to increase the number of bursaries for higher education for the students from the village of Talakondapally.

Sudbury Lions Raise Funds for Vital Research

C of Sudbury have an our annual event called Bhajan and Bhojanwhen to raise funds. This year we raised £4,665.

Congenital Hyperinsulinism (CHI) a condition which causes severe drop in children's blood sugar level. It is due to the pancreas producing too much insulin in a rare condition called Hypoglycaemia, a reverse form of Diabetes! If not corrected, it can lead to loss of consciousness, seizures, potential brain injury and very rarely death. The only solution till recently has been near total pancreatectomy, an invasive operation.

Mr Pratik Shah is the consultant who specialises in Paediatric Endocrinology. He treats children with CHI. Mr Shah and team are researching in newer forms of medication to stabilize blood sugar levels. Instead of parents giving their child 4 injections a day, research has helped to find medication where only 1 injection is given every four weeks thus hugely improving the quality of both child and parents.



Members, their families and guests donated funds in loving memory of their loved ones who have passed on. Encouraged by this we have donated £4,665 to Mr Shah and his team to help fund their research. Lion Kiran Vaghela
