## Delivering a 'shining beacon of hope' to the homeless

Lions of our District A followed District Governor Martin's message of 'Working Together' and were a 'Beacon of Hope' to the homeless of greater London. Lions of Kenton, Hendon, Sudbury and Swiss Cottage were privileged to recently deliver sleeping bags and clothes, purchased with multiple district funds raised specifically for this purpose. LP Pravin had a good value contact for the clothing. Homelessness could happen to any one of us and homeless people come from all walks of life and social backgrounds. When people pass a homeless person begging or sleeping rough on the streets, many choose to look away but, as we discovered, the many volunteers and staff at the centres for the homeless do a fantastic job in helping to turn the lives of these forgotten people – of all ages, some as young as 16 – around.

We were humbled to hear of their ceaseless work all year round providing assistance to these vulnerable people. The Passage Centre at Victoria is being used by over 4,000 homeless people a year! They offer a wide range of services, all year round, to meet the special needs of homeless and vulnerable people. All their work is aimed at helping each individual address the issues that have caused them to become homeless so that he or she can live normally in the community. They offer the homeless not only a hot meal and shelter from the cold streets, but also basic needs such as showers, laundry and donated clothing. The Street Outreach Teams will use our Lions sleeping bags as they make contact with people as they bed down on the streets and encourage them to go into the day centres for food and assistance. All these homeless shelters and centres are in constant need of funds and also extra volunteers.

We delivered bags to The Welldon Shelter in Harrow, The Passage Homeless Centre at Victoria, to the homeless on the streets by The Connection at St Martin's shelter near Charing Cross, to Acton Homeless Concern and Thames Reach London Street Rescue. We have also given some out on the streets with the Sikh Awareness Welfare Team who are working with the homeless on the streets of Southall. Many are sleeping under bridges and by ratinfested bin areas just to keep warm! Whilst delivering sleeping

bags and a box of clothes over to the Fairlop Lions last week, I discovered that the homeless people we had spoken to the previous Sunday evening near Charing Cross were in fact being served food by the Lions of Fairlop, who have been doing this marvellous service for a year now! Well done Fairlop Lions! Swiss Cottage and Stanmore Lions also regularly volunteer with food preparation and serving to the homeless. Also I have just learnt that Lion Ayn of Kingsbury Lions regularly volunteers with an optical charity that provides free eye testing and glasses for the homeless at three of these London centres we visited. Milton Keynes Lions also delivered sleeping bags via The Salvation Army. It is heartwarming to know that many Lions in clubs in both our District and Multiple District are volunteering so much of their time in feeding and assisting the homeless.

We are also raising much awareness of Lions as we carry out this service. Well done to all!

and as with everything she did she threw herself into the role 110% and had a great year. In typical Louvain style since her year as DG she has advised and helped every DG so that they could have as good a year as she did in her beloved Lions.

Louvain was a progressive MJF and has been awarded a number of awards in recognition of the outstanding work she has carried out in the name of Lions over the years.
