CLUB'S WEB SITE - IN 3 EASY STEPS

A number of clubs have been asking about setting up their own web sites and in this article I intend to cover the most basic, easiest and cheapest way to get your club web site up and running.

What you need.

In order to set up a club web site you will need access to the Internet – that is it! This could be at home, office or via an Internet café.

An email address – if you do not have email you can always go to http://www.yahoo.com and sign up for their free email service which can be accessed from any PC with Internet connection anywhere in the world.

What will it cost?

Nothing – if you already have access to the Internet at home or office. Otherwise it will cost whatever you have to pay (at an Internet Café) to get access to the Internet for the time needed to fill in the form on *LionWap* web site.

How do I set up the web site?

Visit http://www.lionwap.org. Click on New Users: Click Here To Open a New Page and read the instructions and click on Continue. Fill in the details on the form.

Recommendations

We recommend that you enter your username as md105a_clubname, and pick any password. This will assist LionNet in quickly identifying which district a username belongs to for support.

Your club web page will be http://www.lionwap.org/clubname (such as http://www.lionwap.org/northolt) or clubname.lionwap.org (Northolt.lionwap.org) if you prefer a shorter version. The page will be set up and available with in 48 hours of submission.

If there is sufficient demand I may cover other methods of setting up your club web site, including domain name etc in a future article.

Enfield do it again!

The Lions Club of Enfield raised £5,500 by taking part in the District Sponsored Walk.

Last year's club President Lion Anant Mehta in the presence of PDG Lion Rati Shah, Secretary, and Lion Rashmi Shah, a Member of the Lions Club of Enfield officially opened the school at Vankaner recently.

The Lions Club of Enfield has also undertaken another school project in the rural village near Rajkot.

Senior Citizens Given New Lease On Life

The Lions of District 105 upstaged the King's Troop Royal Horse Artillery 41-gun salute (on Thursday, February) commemorating the 50th anniversary of Queen Elizabeth II's accession to the throne by jump-starting the Queen's Jubilee with a "100-Lion" salute to acknowledge our gratitude to our senior citizens and to thank them for their guidance and advice reports Lion Elliot Shubert, District Public Relations Officer.

This happened on Sunday, 3 February 2002 at the Harrow Leisure Centre.33 Lions Clubs who acted as their hosts and minders for the day invited over 1,000 senior citizens to the party.

The rather drab Leisure Centre hall was transformed for the day into a glitzy party venue with over 100 tables covered with white cloths, offset with purple or gold overlays, and a sprinkling of



gold stars; table settings with plates, napkins, tumblers; gold and purple helium-filled balloons "floating" over each table. With food and drink prepared, and tables set, all that was needed were the partygoers.

By 1.00 pm the senior citizens started streaming in and were greeted by Lions, Lionesses, Leos, partners and spouses. Also on hand to greet our guests was an unusual looking person, "Bubbles the Clown", who entertained our guests with his funny antics, and Maurice Canham, a "Del Boy" look alike. The seniors loved him!

By 2.00 pm the hall was full of senior citizens and Lions and the party was off to a rockin' start with MC Lion Martin and Ive music by the "Cockney Duo". They played old time favourites, sing-alongs and traditional music. Kylie Spence, whose father is Lion Alec, sang pop songs and Peter (a guest from Northwood) performed a fantastic impression of Nat King Cole songs. Lions, Lionesses and Leos acted as waiters/waitresses and carers to our special guests. A variety of sandwiches and finger food were served. To add to the atmosphere. there were Bingo games and a free raffle with many prizes.

Everyone seemed happy, well fed and looked after. The lively music resulted in spontaneous conger dancing, weaving their way through the maze of tables. In front of the bandstand, round dancing was in full swing. Neither age nor physical condition was a hindrance; people with canes, walkers and even wheel chairs got into the act!

Edna, who is 86 years old, wrote to her hosts, the Redbridge Lions Club, thanking them for being invited. She wrote:

"When I came to the party in 2000, I was really cheered up because as you know Alf was not very well at the time. I did not think that day could be bettered. I almost did not come this time but I am so glad I did. It was the first time I have laughed since Alf died and that is something I thought would never happen for me again. I will always remember and treasure the line of dancers around the hall all laughing and having so much fun and you dancing Doreen with wheelchairs. The time went so auickly I did not want to come home. If I never go out again I will live on my memories of this day."

DG Ram and Shashi were honoured with a visit from the Lord Mayor and Mayoress of Harrow who walked around greeting our senior citizens and posing for photographs. Also, the TV celebrity, Bob Holness, who hosts the game "Call my Bluff" on BBC1 gave a rousing speech for the senior citizens and the Lions.

The end of the day was like the last night at the Proms with the band playing "Land of Hope and Glory" and the national anthem.
