GONE DOWN UNDER!

he above caption may sound depressing but that is where the 93rd International Convention was held from 28th June - 2nd July in Sydney, Australia!

About a dozen of us went 'down under' from our District in a contingent of 130 from MD105 with worldwide attendance of around 15.000 Lions and families.

Convention activities kicked off with a briefing evening on Sunday, 27th June which was sponsored by the MD Travel Agent (Citibond Travel). On Monday, 28th June 24 Lions/partners went on a full day tour of the Blue Mountains via Featherdale Wildlife Park en-route via Sydney Olympic Village.

Tuesday started with International Parade featuring over 10,000 Lions, many in native costumes, floats and marching bands. MD105 was well supported by a pipe band and red rover bus. There was a spectacular international show in the evenina.



In the opening plenary session on Wednesday IPIP Eberhard Wirfs gave his year-end report followed by flag ceremony of 206 countries. Sophie Rosa from our MD representing Europe came second in the Global Music Competition.

On Thursday Humanitarian award was presented to Nobel Peace Prize winner Wangari Maathai from Kenya and in the evening over 600 Lions attended B & I reception at the Star City Hotel. In the last plenary session on Friday delegates were thrilled by keynote address from Chesley "Sully" Sullenberger III, who saved 155 passengers by landing US Airways plane on Hudson river in January 2009.

This was followed by installation of International President 'Sid' L Scruggs III and District Governors which was a moving moment for all of us especially DG Martin and Jill! Lion Kumar Acharya LC of Chipping Barnet


(B) Applications for Host Club or Group for the 2012 and 2013 District Conventions



Jill's Charity – Juvenile Diabetes Research Foundation

Martin and I have two daughters and our younger daughter, Andrea, was diagnosed with Type 1 diabetes in 1980, three months before her 11th birthday.

Type 1 diabetes is a chronic condition and has a life-long impact on those diagnosed with it. People with Type 1 diabetes rely on multiple insulin injections or pump infusions every day just to stay alive. The Juvenile Diabetes Research Foundation (JDRF) works to find a cure for Type 1 diabetes and its complications through the support of research. They also support families living with Type 1 at diagnosis and beyond, providing sources of information including e-newsletters, a quarterly magazine for adults, plus another



one for young people called T1. KIDSAC is their pack for newly diagnosed children and their families which contains an educational CD Rom, useful information and a 'Rufus Bear'. You can see one in the picture – he has felt patches on parts of his body which are there to help teach children about injection and blood testing sites.

We wish that we'd had their kind of support thirty years ago when we needed it but I am delighted that I've now got the opportunity with the Lions of 105A to help them to help others today. Thank you so much.
