Later a presentation took place with the cheque from the Lions of 105A. Winter Forum 2011: Thinking Fun and Fellowship

GLT Chair Elliot Shubert described the plan for the day with a brief PP presentation. Cons Noms Res Officer, Colin Davies presented the three VDG candidates [Lions Sarbjit Assi (London Acton), Ramesh Parmar (Edgware) & Mina Gupta (Osterley)] and each candidate gave a 5 minute speech.

This was followed with a variety of one-hour seminars (repeated twice, but with a coffee break in between). The Seminars were grouped as: Leadership: Leading by Example (Harry Lote), Mentoring (Eileen Cox), & Effective Communication (Elliot Shubert); Membership: Recruiting & Retaining Members (Cheryl Peacock and Veni Vaghela), & Making Meetings Enjoyable (Alistair Joel); also two-hour seminars on: Certified Guiding Lions (Geoff Leeder), Leo Advising (Minesh Mehta) & Deaf Aware Training (Penny Tregillus).

After an excellent lunch, an Ice Breaker was conducted on the theme: What is your favourite place? Lions and Leos were challenged to meet as many other people and record their favourite place. First prize (a box of Ferrero Rocher chocolates) was won by Dinesh Shonchahtra (Kingsbury). This was followed by small group discussions focused on: What did you learn today and what will you take back and share with your club? Overall, there were many positive comments, but some wanted longer sessions and more role play. DG Andrew and 1st VDG John gave the closing remarks.
