During the month of July, we were pleased to welcome into Lions Clubs in this District the following new members:

I had the honour myself to induct the new members of Ampthill on the occasion of my official visit, thank you Ampthill for allowing me that honour. A good start fellow Lions but, in the month of July we also dropped 12 members so the scales need to be rebalanced.

District Re-zoning

The decision has been made by Cabinet that it is necessary to undertake a re-zoning exercise within the District. Some Regions and Zones are already up to the maximum number of clubs allowed – 16 per Region and 8 per Zone thus restricting the opportunity for further growth within those areas. In other zones there are only 4 clubs, thus there is a great inequality in membership numbers across the District. IPDG Parveen in his year asked for feedback from clubs regarding rezoning to be sent to me by 30th July. I received comments from 2 clubs and one District Officer. Fellow Lions this is your opportunity to let the cabinet know your feelings/preferences. At Cabinet, I informed Region and Zone Chairmen that my timescale was as follows:

31st August - final date for feedback from Clubs/Zones/Regions

September/October— Forward planning committee meet and come up with a draft proposal

October 31st – draft proposal is circulated to all clubs and District Officers by e mail with the DG Newsletter

November 30th – final date for receiving further feedback from clubs on the draft proposal

December – Forward Planning Committee meet for the second time to review the feedback and amend proposal if necessary

January 14th – final proposal presented to Cabinet for approval.

I want to ensure by this lengthy timetable that all clubs have the opportunity to debate the issue and then give feedback to the District, this is not re-zoning for re-zoning sake, this is vital for the continued growth of this District. So, fellow Lions, you have the chance – take it and let us know what you would like to do. All feed back to Lion Andrew Allen, Chairman Forward Planning Committee, copied to me.

At the end of the day, I am prepared to induct, in front of the whole assembly, any new members that you may have in the pipeline. This will also happen at Convention next year in March 2001, an induction ceremony conducted by International Director Phil Nathan if there are any candidates.

Use of e-technology

Last month for the first time I sent out the DGs newsletter by e-mail. Instead of sending it by post to 60+ District officers and PDGs and 91 Lions. Leos and Lioness Clubs. I was able to hit one button and send it to all bar 13 District Officers and 19 clubs. What a saving in time and an example of making good use of available technology. However, all the work that I may have ideas about, be it website work, database work etc, needs someone to undertake it at District level and currently the two District Officers, Geoff Brown and Satnam Loyal are overwhelmed with work.
