DG's Newsletter Distribution

Zone Meetings

At Winter Forum comments were made by manv Zone Chairmen that they were experiencing low numbers attending their Zone meetings and would like to see more. Well sometimes it is necessary to look at the fundamental way that Zone Meetings are structured and see if this is the reason for low attendance. Why not try something different next time - invite more speakers and spend time on reports; circulate reports less beforehand and only take comments on them by exception or if there is a query from another club; invite speakers external to Lions, but easiest of all ask the clubs in your zone what they would like. So clubs, if you want to see Zone Meetings conducted differently the answer lies with yourselves to put forward and agree suggestions.

This ensures that the money is working as soon as possible for those who need it. Also we have now been advised that, as a result of this appeal via Lions of this District, information about the charity and it's work is now available throughout Milton Keynes Community Trust and also in the trusts in Oxfordshire – this is the other objective that Brigid wished to achieve and it is being achieved. Zone Accounts

At the last Cabinet meeting the question of Zone Accounts was raised and there appeared to be some confusion over the issue. PDG Vanmali Mistry —a past District Treasurer and currently Chairman of the Honorary Committee – has taken this matter up with Lion Mike Greenaway, the Multiple District Legal Advisor, and has received this ruling and advice which is re-produced here for your guidance:

"At the request of the District Governor, I pen below my views on the banking accounts established other than for Lions Clubs, as, at the last cabinet meeting, it was found that some Zones and Regions had at one time or another established banking accounts in the names of the Zone/Region to facilitate fundraising projects, District projects and activities to include that relating to hosting of District Conventions and other projects jointly undertaken by two or more clubs.

Whilst I understand and appreciate the reasons for such accounts being opened, and that they would be properly administered and accounted for, I am of the opinion, that it is entirely out of order in that neither Zone nor the Region have any legal status, (in the accepted sense and as confirmed by the MD Legal Advisor) and, as such, as a 'Body' i.e. Zone/region (which is purely for District Administration purposes only) do not have the powers or rights to establish, hold and operate bank accounts. In the context of Lions, only clubs organised under a standard club constitution as well as District, Multiple Districts and such other properly constituted 'bodies' are entitled to and can have a bank account opened in their respective names.

That being the case, and in the event something goes wrong, and whilst the banks may have unknowingly opened the accounts in the names of Zones/regions, they will have the right of recourse on the signatories to the bank mandate, i.e. those Lion members who are mentioned on the bank mandate will be personally liable as individuals.

I therefore suggest that any such accounts now in existence be closed forthwith or as soon as practicable.

It is also appreciated that there is still a need to have banking accounts to manage various Projects and Activities which are jointly undertaken by a group of clubs i.e. zones/regions. In which event it is suggested that the accounts be opened as a 'sub account' of a club in that group or, with the permission of the District Governor/Secretary/Treasurer, a 'sub account' under the mandate of the District designated – Lions Clubs International District 105A – say Zone E project, District 105A Convention, Region 3 Activity etc, etc.

The signatories to these accounts will be those authorised under the respective Bank Mandates of the Club or the District, or as varied to accommodate smooth operation of those designated sub accounts.
