Diabetes Screening - Hayes & Harlington Lions Club

Diabetes is known to be the third biggest killer & single cause of blindness in the world. In UK appx. 8% of the population are victims of this disease. Diabetes awareness is as important as the precautions one should take. Lions Club of Hayes & Harlington have been involved in the screening and has proved to be an invaluable service to the community. With the help of 4 nurses from the Diabetes Unit at Hillingdon Hospital diabetes screening was held at the Hayes Carnival on Saturday 13 July, in order to identify adverse levels of sugar in the persons' blood. Of the 130 tested, 3 were positive and were referred to their GP's. This event has proved to be a very valuable public relations exercise as well. A few people who had come last year remembered the Lions and the service we provide. We also had a visit from the Mayor of London Borough of Hillingdon which attracted more people to our stand. I must conclude that this is a well worth effort, not only for the benefit of the public but also for the enhancement of the image of the Lions generally.

New Lion President Starts at the Run



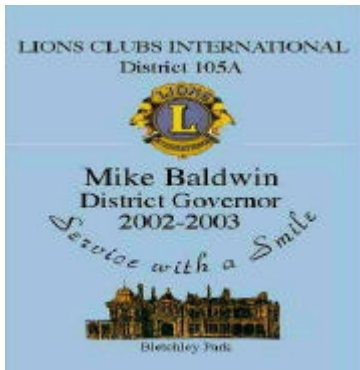

International Convention Osaka

Well the International Convention has come and gone and I am left with many differing impressions. Firstly of the City of Osaka itself. It is a city of many contrasts. High level free running freeways give way to heavily congested city roads. The people eat wisely to stay healthy yet nearly everyone seems to smoke. It is a city of wealthy people yet the river banks are the home to many as the economic downturn bites. It was also our base for 12 days.

The convention began, as far as I was concerned with the District Governor Elects school. 5 days of fairly intensive work. MD105 was in the same syndicate as MD's 5M & 7. We thus shared our time with Lions from USA & Canada. It is clear that the training provided by MD 105 for DGE's is as good as any and once more contrasts were apparent. Some DG's can make a club visit to each club and never have to travel more than half an hour from their home. My twin Governor from Australia on the other hand, has a District which runs from Adelaide to Darwin, some 3,000 miles away.

And so to the convention itself. If I am honest, I have mixed views about it. It was announced as the biggest convention ever but I felt it lacked real atmosphere and real numbers. Only on the first day were there any significant numbers in the Dome. On the second day, the day of the key note speaker I would put the figure at less than 3,000. On the day before convention opened the parade was held in Universal Studios and this was a great success and Janet and I enjoyed every minute of it. Overall this was the convention at which Janet and I were installed and we will never forget it nor the very many new friends we made or the fact that 14 Lions from 105A attended. Thank you to all of them.

Impact

This is a word that all Lions are going to hear a lot about in the coming year. Our International President Kay K Fukushima has, as one of his objectives, the increase of new club formation from the current average of 1,100 clubs per year to 2,200 clubs in 2002-2003 (a 100% increase). To help achieve his objective he has appointed 22 Impact leaders worldwide. Ours is PID Lion Phil Nathan who also has responsibility for France, Germany, Belgium, The Netherlands, Luxembourg and I think Croatia. Lion Phil has appointed Team Leaders and PDG Doug Cross has accepted the post for MD105. He will be helped by Liaison Officers and ours is PCC David Firth, who is also looking after Districts 105D and 105SE. Lion David will liaise closely with our MERCL Team
