Haven House Children

Haven House Children's Hospice was conceived in the early 1990s to provide care to life-limited children and their families at no cost to them. A 99 year lease was acquired on the White House, a locally listed former family home set in four acres of protected woodland. Many families from all walks of life have had support from the Hospice, children ranging from birth to 19 years of age, both on site and more recently in the patient's homes. Families also take advantage of support groups designed to reduce stress and anxiety of difficult decisions and challenging times.

Their Vision is to provide the best possible life for every baby child and young person with life-limiting or life-threatening conditions along with support from their families

Their Mission is to provide the highest quality palliative and holistic

care from birth through teenage years.

Their Target through the generosity of Businesses/ Individuals, and hopefully the Lions of District 105A, is to provide services for life-limited and life-threatened children and their families.

As the DG team (DG Doreen, 1st VDG Kamal and 2nd VDG Alastair) visit Clubs within our District they will have information available and be able to answer questions.
