Moor Park make record donations

Lions Club of Moor Park hosted a social meeting on 25th Feb at Venue 5, Eastcote which was attended by DG John Savell, 1st VDG Sarbjit Assi, 2nd VDG Ramesh Parmar, PDG Max Mongia, PDG Vijay Arora, Zone E Chair Ravina Rattan, Zone G Chair Himanshu Bavaria, Mr. Ian Murdoch from Moorefield Eye Hospital and other Lions.

The main item on the agenda was the Lions Moorefield Ghana Eye Hospital where Moor Park Lions donated US\$100,000 towards the Campaign Sight program.

Moor Park Club's own project is to build a 50 bed Children's Pediatric Hospital near Baroda (India), where the Club has already spent £290,000 towards the initial construction of the building. The Hospital will be opened in October/November this year.

More than 70 swimmers ranging from senior citizens to the very young took part with support from their family and friends. Medals and certificates were presented by the Mayor of Hounslow and the Mayor of Spelthorne to all swimmers who after their participation felt as if they had competed in their own Olympics.

Now in its 21st year the Gala attracts teams from outside the immediate Zone C area. These include Eltham, South East London and Barking in Essex. Every swimmer received a medal for completing at least one length of the 25m pool.
