Lions help the homeless

When considering what charity Linda Savell, wife of 105A IPDG John Savell wanted to support for the year, there were a number of considerations. It should relate to young people, those who had become homeless or those who had been abused, neglected or where it was simply too dangerous for them to remain at home. The charity should be part of the Street Children program, have a strong educational theme, and be UK based.

After visiting a number of hostels run by the London based charity Centrepoint, Linda opted to support the charity. During the year Linda was ably assisted by the Street Children Officer Lion Vivien Raggett whose photograph is the insert. This was a charity which the District 105A took to their hearts and raised a magnificent sum of £9100 which was presented to the fundraiser of Centrepoint, Martin Pare-Hall at a small ceremony at the head office in Whitechapel London. Unfortunately Lion Vivien was ill and unable to attend but Lion Joginder Gill, the current Street Children Officer, was present. The money is ring fenced to be used for the educational needs of the young people.

Centrepoint helps young people all over the country with a new hostel opening November in Bradford, following on from the service centre opened in Sunderland last year.

Aid for Philippines Disaster

have some very exciting news for you regarding the Lifesaver Gerry cans appeal for the Philippines. You may recall that LCIF had purchased a pallet of 56 Lifesaver water filter Gerry cans and made the recommendation to us that this was the right product needed in the disaster area. Whilst launching the appeal in MD 105 we also approached LCIF and requested that they help this appeal by 'pump priming' our efforts to enable us to move more quickly.

I am pleased to advise that LCIF have just authorised \$50,000 so that we can immediately order the first 168 Lifesaver units. Donations from the current appeal to clubs will repay this loan, and when repaid, LCIF have agreed we can approach them for a further \$50,000.

Much work has been going on with the Lions of the Philippines to ensure efficient deployment to the people that need them most. As with all disaster areas communication has been difficult but all the necessary paperwork has been obtained and Lions are waiting to distribute them.

Please send any donations for the Lifesaver appeal to your District Treasurer or District Charity Treasurer.

On behalf of the people of the Philippines thank you to all of you for reacting so promptly to this appeal. I will of course keep you updated on progress.

London Chinatown Lions Club in Dragon Race



A record crowd of more than ten thousand people of all nationalities and ethnic backgrounds enjoyed the London Hong Kong Dragon Boat Festival 2013, which took place at the London Regatta Centre in the Royal Albert Dock, east London on Saturday, June 30.

It was the 18th annual London Hong Kong Dragon Boat Festival, organised by The London Chinatown Lions Club, and jointly supported by The London Chinatown Chinese Association and the Hong Kong Executives Club. The Hong Kong Economic Trade Office was the event's principal sponsor.

As well as a full day of competition on the River Thames involving 40 dragon boat teams on a brilliant summer's day, the festival featured cultural performances including lion and dragon dancing, live music, martial arts demonstrations and traditional dancing. It also included the first East-West music festival featuring local and UK pop music acts. There was a food festival allowing people to taste traditional Asian dishes. Two return tickets to Hong Kong and various cash prizes were among the raffle prize draw on the day.

Our vision for this riverside festival is to remain firmly established as one of London's major sport and cultural events, and with it to not only entertain and provide enjoyment for the many, but also to raise fund for those less fortunate in our Chinese community. Together with the



generous support from members of London Chinatown Lions Club, we achieved our vision of charitable work and accomplished our mission with great success.

All the proceeds will be distributed to a number of nominated Chinese community associations, and to LCIF's signature projects.
