
Lions Shelter -National Memorial Arboretum

n a unique haven of peace within 150 acres of wooded parkland and amid other memorials stands a stunning memorial giving the names of 16,000 Service men and women killed on duty or by terrorist action since the end of the Second World War. As our organisation is dedicated to Service it was decided to serve by providing shelter for the many visitors to the National Memorial Arboretum. Lions Clubs throughout the British Isles and Ireland have raised funds to support the construction of the Lions Club Shelter.

On Wednesday 14th September our Royal Patron, Her Royal Highness The Countess of Wessex G.C.V.O., accompanied by the Lord Lieutenant and PDG Tony Gadsby, Chairman of Council of Governors, dedicated the Shelter in the presence of invited guests. With space within the shelter somewhat limited, many Lions were gathered in front to observe the proceedings. On departing the Shelter Her Royal Highness spoke with many of the onlookers.

After a buffet lunch in a marquee adjoining the visitors centre Her Royal Highness met the guests, 25 District Governors and partners, and was presented with a number of DG's banners before finally departing.
