
Lions Club of Enfield is always in quest for providing new ways to become involved in relevant issues and serve in a way that fits our world's ever changing life styles.

# Further personal thoughts

Following up from my previous note, I wanted to draw attention to another source of difficulty: communication or rather the lack of it. I wrote an article for the 105A News some 25 years ago, which was referred to at a cabinet meeting not too long ago: I think the message is worth repeating.

Many of our problems arise because of lack of or poor communication. How often does someone say "I didn't know, no-one told me" or an instruction has been incomplete or misunderstood because it lacks clarity?

We are being overwhelmed by the explosion of technology, emails, smart phones etc. which lead us to believe that our communication is better. But is it?

Communication requires at least two people who wish to understand one another. Too often we send out an email and feel that our action is concluded, but if there is no response? Perhaps the email was not received or the system not opened the email. Then the communication has failed and we are not aware of it. And have we asked the right question or asked the question in the right way? Although I retired from the District cabinet some eight years ago I have endeavoured to attend whenever possible and it seems clear to me that when cabinet reports are circulated on line they are not read; with a few exceptions there is only perfunctory discussion and there seems no feeling that any decisions are, or should be, cabinet decisions involving all members and not just the DG and his/her advisory team. What happened to collective responsibility?

The image which we present as an organisation has a bearing on our ability to recruit and retain members. We must appear dynamic and forward looking in achieving our aims, but at the same time enjoying what we do and having fun! Let us make sure that our new members are immediately involved and understand the wider purposes of the Association or we will continue to decline. We must maintain a proper balance between our local activities, which can include social functions either just for ourselves or organised for community benefit, and our support for our international obligations (from which, of course, we can benefit at club or District level when appropriate).

Recruitment and retention is the job of all members, not just nominated officers or committees; let us all try to improve our image and persuade our friends and acquaintances of the benefits of membership.

Let the debate continue.

I visited last year's District 105A Best Website winners the Lions Club of Biggleswade Sandy, who had decided to be in the same colours as their District Governor!


At my official visit to the club I presented a 10 year Monarch Chevron to Lion Peter Patmore and my banner
