

MD105 and the Marie Curie Great Daffodil Appeal

The Council of Governors has approved a working agreement with Marie Curie to assist with their Great Daffodil Appeal (GDA) 2013.

The GDA includes collections at Tesco Stores through-out British Isles and Northern Ireland spread over the period 7th February 2013 to 28th March, most collections are 8th and 15th March. MD 105 has been offered the opportunity to collect on behalf of GDA.

Lions Clubs collecting at the stores will be recognised as Lions Clubs collecting on behalf of Marie Curie raising funds for care in the local community. Every £20 collected will pay for one hours care in the local community. Posters will be produced explaining this. During the collection Lions will be wearing Lions Tabards and PR releases will be issued locally recognising the work of Lions.

Lions will benefit from recognition amongst the supporters of Marie Curie Cancer Care in print and on their web site.

Every club with a participating Tesco store nearby (there are 650 listed) will be approached by the local Marie Curie Fund Raiser to enquire if they want to be involved and are able to support a collection. We are providing telephone numbers of clubs to Marie Curie to facilitate this process. They have signed an agreement restricting their use of this information.

For those Clubs who agree to support the appeal Marie Curie will provide a full briefing document.

Our previous work with Marie Curie was successful but was felt not to have fully recognised the part played by Lions Clubs, this working agreement addresses these issues.

Belmont Lions help the Homeless

ions Club of London Belmont presented "DENS" with food parcels for the homeless and a cheque for £ 225 towards their Christmas party.

DENS, started in 1998, is an independent charity, supporting homeless people in and around the Dacorum area of Hertfordshire - Hemel Hempstead, Berkhamsted, Tring, Kings Langley and the surrounding villages.

In 2003 DENS opened a permanent night shelter, open 365 nights a year. In 2005 DENS opened a Day Centre for 3 days a week and from 2008 began operating on a 5 day a week basis.

DENS currently operates 6 main services: Dacorum Foodbank, DENS Day Centre, the Night Shelter, Move-On Accommodation, Dacorum Rent Aid, and DENS Retail.

The presentation was made at a dinner held by and at Lion President Surriya Rahman's residence in Hemel Hempstead. Other Lions present were the 2nd VDG Ramesh Parmer, Zone Chair Ravina Rattan, District PR Officer Naresh Gupta, DO Meena Gupta, Charter President, Amin Dada and other members of London Belmont.



Ms Millie Stone of "DENS" commented: "Lions Club of London Belmont have always supported our organisation by way of food parcels, donations and also blankets for the homeless. We will always be indebted to them. I have learnt a lot about Lionism and may even one day consider joining Lions as a member"
