Fairlop Leos help the Grenfell survivors



ithin a few hours of the fire, Fairlop Leos Club responded to the recent Grenfell Tower tragedy in June, by organising the purchasing of 393 rucksacks filled with essential school items, for primary children 5-10 year olds and secondary students 11-17 year olds plus smaller books and toys for the pre-school age group.

Raising over £2000 of the funds themselves, their sponsors, Fairlop Lions and other 105A Clubs helped with the total needed. Each family affected has an individual keyworker within the Grenfell Response Team. These



rucksacks were delivered to them for distribution to the families in time for the start of the new School term in September. The Leos also ensured a floral tribute was organised from the Lions family of

The project is ongoing with the Leos set to provide a Legacy Library for the Grenfell Tower Nursery and another for the Kensington Academy where four pupils lost their lives in the tragedy. These two will be funded by the Leos alone.

A real bonus is that at least two local schools are interested in finding out how the Lions organisation can enhance their students volunteering with the Leos Club of Beal Academy chartering early in the new School year.

From London they all went to their next camp in Worcester to join the other youths. In all there were nearly 40 youths from 29 countries at the Worcester camp.
