Lions of MD105 Give direct help to the people of Kashmir and those on our own doorstep

Through the past generosity of Lions of this MD we have been able to give practical help to the people of Kashmir.

Because we were in credit with donations, and had some stock from our past sleeping bag appeals, with permission from the Council of Governors, we have been able to send 300 sleeping bags, hats and scarves to the people of Kashmir. These were taken to the cargo bay for despatch by Pakistan Airlines, on 16 November. Although the donations were originally

for MD105 it was felt that the need of the people of Kashmir, as winter falls on them was, for the moment, overriding.

We intend to follow this donation by a further 1000 sleeping bags, once we are sure that the first 300 have reached those in need. We are confident they will, as we have arranged for the Council Chairperson of the Region to

meet the plane and to take charge of the consignment.

All District Governors and District Street Children Officers were appraised of our donation and all the feed back to me has so far been very positive.

I am grateful for all the work done by **District Officer Brindar Singh Nandra of District 105A** for collecting, packing and transporting the bags to Heathrow and for contacting the Council Chairperson in Pakistan. In addition Lion Brindar has sourced a new supplier which will enable the additional 1000 sleeping bags to be purchased at a cost of £6000.

In depleting our stocks and finance I am conscious of the continuing need of the homeless within our MD and have ordered a further 100 sleeping bags, hats and scarves for use here. These will be delivered in the near future.

Once these have been delivered and paid for we will need to replenish our funds and I would ask all clubs to consider making a donation to *The MD Sleeping Bag Appeal*.

Remember for a donation of just £90 we can purchase the necessary equipment to help 3 homeless people. Donations should be made to your District Treasurer and be marked MD Sleeping Bag Appeal. (£30 to a homeless person in the form of a sleeping bag can mean the difference between life and death)

Fellow Lions of MD 105 I hope that our action in temporarily switching the emphasis from home to Kashmir meets with your approval and that however

The organisers in UK were astounded at the generosity of Lions and have thanked ALL Lions.



The children of today who will one day be Lions.


