YOUTH FOOTBALL COMPETITION 2008 DISTRICT 105A

Can I ask you to take this Article to your next Club meeting? It may be for your President elect would be the right person to handle this.

I would like your Club to consider an entry into next year's Youth Football Competition. This might seem rather early to ask you this, but there are only a very few weeks left for you to check out a suitable team actually in action. This is the only UEFA approved tournament at this level which covers five countries. This season the age category has changed to U14.

The benefits to your Club by entering this competition are considerable. You obviously create a direct link between Lions and young people in your community and help bridge that huge generation gap. You also latch on to possibly a new sphere of your community - mums, dads, brothers, sisters, grandparents, and your local football organization. PR can be a big plus point with lots of good photo opportunities. Influential business contacts and potential new members are also possible. Socializing with new Lions is also a benefit.

The competition allows your local team to meet and play new sides and perhaps gain the chance to play on the big stage in the closing rounds. In the past some very 'small-time' teams have done really well. This is the nature of our knockout competition.

Your Club would need to provide some financial assistance from your Charity account for the team, in terms of total costs for the whole competition in 2005/6 they amounted to approximately £500. However your team might only play one match and total costs might be only £75 or less. Some Clubs gain sponsorship for their team and also take advantage of the MD subsidy for travel costs thus possibly making a profit out of the tournament.

HELPFUL HINTS

In practice, the Football Team Manager does most of the work leaving the Club Lion I/C to pursue the benefits mentioned above and oversee matters.

The details can be downloaded from the Lions MD website www.lions.org.uk/football.htm Sunday only matches have been seen as a problem but this is a flexible guideline and Saturday or even midweek fixtures are quite possible.

You have until the end of August to make your formal entry, but an early start is recommended. My contact details are in the book on page 18 and I would be pleased to help you, or even come to one of your meetings.

Also If you have a Leo Club you can forward this to them.

Fellow Lions this year we had four teams in the tournament with your help we can double it to eight or even more. I hope to hear from you soon.

GALA CHARITY BALL LIONS CLUB OF ENFIELD

This year Lions Club of Enfield held its annual Gala Charity Ball on Saturday, 26th April, 2008 at SAS Radissons Portman Hotel, London. There were 275 guests. Mr. Vijaybhai Patel, Mr. Bhikhubhai Patel of Waymade Healthcare PLC and their ladies were Chief Guests. Under their patronage and munificent support, a number of projects, such as Medical Camps, Eve Camps, Polio camps, an IT School in Wankaner and building of schools in India and Eldoret have been completed by Lions Club of Enfield. Mr. Chris Holmes, MA (Cantab) MBE, Britain's most successful Paralympic swimmer ever winning 9 gold medals was the Chief Guest Speaker and gave a very moving speech. There were also invited guests from India who are all involved in the education and charitable fields and Lion Dhiru Shah, PDG, District 411, from Mombasa, Kenya.

Lion President Madhu Trivedi, welcomed all the guests and then gave brief details of his projects. He said that with the help and co-operation of Club members, he has undertaken to raise funds for a Childrens Eye unit in Gujarat. The Eye Hospital to be known as The Lions Club of Enfield (UK) Children's Wing will include the latest out patient, diagnostic services and latest surgical and medical equipments. The Children's Wing has an Operating Theatre, Out-patients' Clinic, Children's ward and 6 rooms for parents to stay while their children are receiving treatment. The cost of this project is £100,000. The Club Members agreed to raise further funds to donate a purpose-built ambulance to a Blood Bank that would enable staff to go into the rural country and obtain vitally needed blood supply. The Club also agreed to raise funds for Netra Jvot Eye Hospital in Mumbai which needs latest surgical and medical equipments to treat patients suffering from eye ailments.

The Gala Charity Ball raised a sum of £140,000. Main donors included Mr. Vijaybhai & Bhikhubhai Patel, Lion Rati Shah, Dr. Harbhaggan Plaha, Rotary Club of Billiricky and Mayflower and Lion Dhiru Shah of Mombasa & Lions Club of Mill Hill.

Snowdon 500 Challenge It pays to advertise!

The Nov/Dec Lion magazine carried an advert inviting anyone to trek to the top of Mt Snowdon in aid of the Prostate Cancer Research Centre London.

It was a shock to me in Sept 07 when I was diagnosed with grade 2 prostate cancer. It was a bigger shock to find that PC is the most prevalent, under researched, and most frequently diagnosed male cancer in the UK.

30,000 men are diagnosed every year, and one man will die every hour in the UK of prostrate cancer. Why are men so reluctant to discuss serious illness such as cancer with their GP or even their families?

More research is vital to beat this most common male cancer. Raising funds seemed to me a very good idea. I told the Lions Club of Bletchley what I wanted to do and immediately got the backing of the whole club and five volunteers to climb with me.

May 17th was dull, damp, and mild. We arrived in Llanberis the night before and were first on the mountain at 7.50 am next morning. Up the Miners track and then the Pig trail to the summit. Three hours later shrouded in cloud and freeing temperatures we were there. We didn't linger and set off on the 5-mile trek down, the sometimes steep and rough, Llanberis path to sign off two and a half hours later, Mission achived!

Later fish and chips in Pete's Café never tasted so good. About 450 people answered the challenge to raise £100,000. Our results about £3500. The only Lions club there !!

Moral to this story? One in three males over 55 in the UK will be affected by Prostate Cancer. Much of our Lions membership is male and over 55! So don't delay go and see your GP get checked out and ask for a PSA test and help to beat Prostate Cancer.



My thanks to my fellow climbers Lions Reg Humphreys, Mike Baldwin, Solveig Bruce-Stupples, John Stupples, and Barry Bates. It was a great day, one to remember for a long time.


